

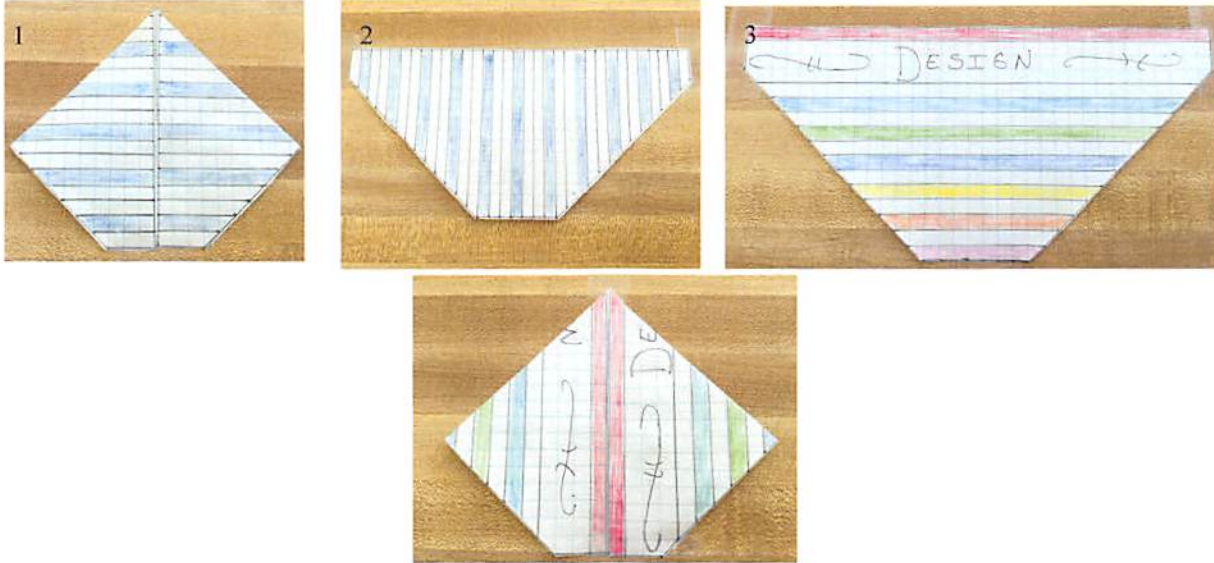
Quilted Shawl Instructions

Please feel free to use you creative mind when designing your shawl

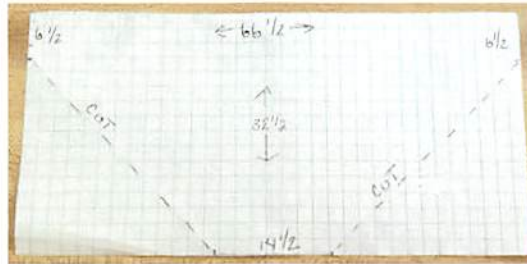
Planning:

- (1) Consider what the matching ends look like when folded around.
- (2) For this pattern you will need 33 strips 2 ½" x 34" * always use quarter in seam allowance.
- (3) For this design you will need one strip 6 ½" by 66 ½" and 13 strips 2 ½ x 66 ½ * always use quarter in seam allowance.



Trimming:

IMPORTANT your finished measurements are no larger than the following



Use the excess in scrappy projects.

Backing:

You will need 2yds of polar fleece (** this product should not be ironed directly) – cut off a 12 inch strip on the end to use for pockets (this is to be cut in half). Cut the remaining piece in half as shown:



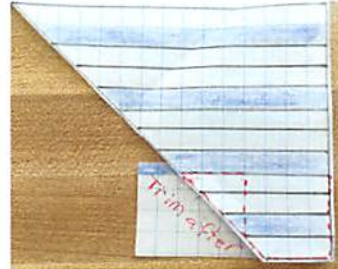
Depending on which design you chose you will roll fabric so that you can machine quilt. This will stay sandwiched together nicely during the whole process.

Use a bobbin thread that matches your polar fleece and the top color that complements your piece. Try to start your stitching on the polar fleece and end there as well. Use the seam lines as your guide and do a quilting line on each side.

Once quilting is completed you can trim polar fleece to match the top.

Pockets:

Using half of the 12 in strip you cut off polar fleece -- sew binding along one side.



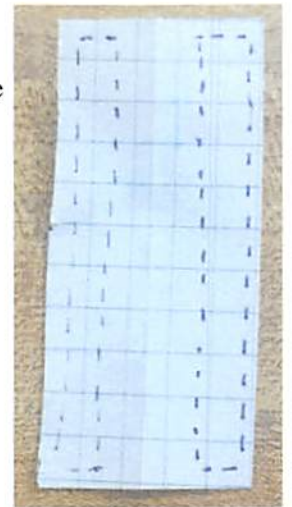
Placement -- measure up between 6-8 in, depending on how deep you would like your pocket, pin into place. Stitch as shown and trim, repeat on each side.

Binding:

14' of binding is needed to finish outside edge of shawl -make your own to match-- 2 1/2 strip folded in half sew to front and roll to polar fleece side and finish.

Closure tab:

Fabric should measure 3" x 8" (x2) with right sides together sew 1/4 seam leaving opening to turn inside out and stitch opening closed. On one side stitch hook and loop full length of tab. Stitch other half of hook and loop onto shawl. The base of the tab should start right above the pocket and be placed right next to the binding edge. Once in place align with other side pin and sew into place tab should look like this once sewn on.



You are now done!!
