Nancy is an international Quilter, Teacher, Fabric Designer, and Author of 14 books. Her Program, titled "Two Block Wonders", will show us how to place two different blocks side by side to create extraordinary quilts. Every quilter can make unique quilts. Nancy will share her quilts with us and tips for successfully pairing-up blocks to create dazzling results. May 17 Workshop – Blooming Feathered Star

Nancy will teach a class on making a feathered star block. The 44" × 44" block can stand alone as a wall hanging or put 4 blocks to-



gether to create a stunning quilt. You will learn cutting and piecing techniques for making accurate triangle squares. Different colorways can be seen at the Program Table. Cost is \$45 and includes the pattern.

If you want to take the workshop, email Jamie Jones. This workshop requires gathering your fabrics and cutting to specifications before the class. When you email me, I will send you the fabric requirements and cutting instructions. You can pay for the workshop at the May Guild meeting. (this workshop will be the last professional teacher until November)

The QOV Sew-In Bee is a group of guild members who get together at the home studio of Joanne Jones. Meetings are every other Friday, 10-3. Attendance is flexible but Joanne can accommodate 9 quilters at a time. In addition to piecing quilt tops, Joanne is teaching interested members to long arm their own quilt tops on her long arm machine. The members also belong to the Gwinnett National Chapter of the Quilts of Valor Foundation which meets monthly.

The bee was formed about 10 years ago and were featured in a local magazine, "Up Close and Personal in Lilburn" Vol 7 Issue 2 as a group of Lilburn women quilting for our soldiers.

This active group shares patterns and fabric completing about 35 quilts. In addition to piecing and quilting these tops they have awarded quilts at presentations in their community.

If you are looking to provide a personal touch to our often-forgotten veterans, this is a good place to start. These quilts become a tangible way to express our appreciation for their service.
