Message from our Vice-President

Cannon Cause this month is personal care items: laundry detergent, shampoo and conditioner, baby diapers, PullUps, Adult diapers, toilet paper, toothpaste. This is also the list posted on the bin at the church and the co-op is in need of baby diapers in sizes 3 and 6 and all sizes of adult diapers.

Other items they are in need of currently are: canned fruits, grains such as- grits, oatmeal, cold cereals, noodles, and canned pasta. Canned protein - canned chicken, tuna , Soups-No broth or cream soups, Spaghetti sauce and jelly.

- \gg In September we'll collect dry items. Many are on the lists above.
- > October is baby items,
- $m \succ$ November will be warm items- gloves, mittens, hats, scarves, socks
- >> December we'll collect items for Feed My Lambs. These will be used to distribute to school children that may not have enough to eat at home over the winter break. Canned pasta or mac and cheese that can be heated in the microwave, granola bars, protein bars, fruit cups, etc.
- After the September meeting we will have a sew in to make breast cancer pillows. We'll collect those in October which is breast cancer awareness month.
- In November it will be placemats and also mug rugs to give to Meals On Wheels. In you make 2 matching please safety pin them together so they can go to a couple. If you don't have enough fabric to make a placemat maybe you can make a cute mug rug. Anything will be appreciated

- Sheila Wheeler's mother-in-law is ill.


