

Vice Presidents Message

We collected 455 placemats and 54 mug rugs. They have been delivered to Gwinnett Meals On Wheels in Lawrenceville- and I got them there before Thanksgiving! We usually deliver the placemats to Gwinnett Senior Services but they still had leftovers from last year so they suggested the Gwinnett Meals On Wheels and that worked out well. They are also located next to Veteran Family Services and will share the placemats with them.

The last 50 breast cancer pillows were delivered to Hebron Church to their cancer ministries.

Cannon Cause this month is Feed My Lamb which asks for individually wrapped items for children to be able to prepare by themselves while at home over the holidays.

There is always a need for ladies personal care items and baby diapers and wipes, toothpaste and toothbrushes.

This month there is also a request out for canned pasta

In January we will collect canned goods and in February it will be baby items.

We have a new community service project: Lindsay Hatfield with Affinis Hospice contacted us and would like us to make some fidget quilts and/or aprons for their patients in the memory care unit. She would like to have 10 but I bet we can do better than that. The quilts can be as small as a placemat or a little larger like a lap blanket -many are in wheelchairs. The aprons can be full or half aprons. Anything attached as to be secure so they can't pull it off. I'll have a sample in January but there are many examples on the internet.



For those unfamiliar with quilt turnings, you are in for a treat! They are perhaps the precursor to our Show and Tell programs at today's quilt guild meetings. If space was limited, they would lay them all out on a bed, stacked one on top of the other. As each quilt was held up for viewing— "turned" -- the owner would talk about the quilt and tell its story.

The quilts presented at our quilt turning are more than 50 years old and owned by Chattahoochee Evening Stars Quilt Guild members. Some quilts have been handed down for generations, with documented stories, and are part of the heritage of that family. In other cases, the provenance of the quilt is unknown. Some have even been used for paint drop cloths!
