

Denise Russell is coming to us from Kennesaw, GA and will be presenting a Trunk Show & program on, "I Love Fabric Panels: How Can I Design a Quilt Using Them." As 2023 ends and a new year begins, I want to take this opportunity to THANK each of you for your donation of time and pillowcases. The organization could not function without your incredibly generous contributions. YOU are the essential piece of the puzzle that helps the entire family cope with one of life's most terrifying experiences while building resilience for the future. We are ever grateful for the role YOU play in these families' lives.

Ryan's Case For Smiles (RCFS) began 16 years ago with a simple gesture by a mom wanting to make a hospital room a little less sterile for her son. That simple gesture has turned into over 2.7 million pillowcases (aka 'smiles') being delivered to children nationwide.

A hospital experience can be terrifying and traumatic for both a child and their family. While others strive to find cures for childhood diseases and illnesses, Ryan's Case For Smiles helps with the stress and emotional impact of an illness in the here and now. Our whimsical pillowcases give children an emotional boost, while resources and tools developed by RCFS help families better understand and cope with the experience. In 2023, the 'Case For Smiles' Georgia Chapter delivered a total of 6,922 pillowcases to 15 hospital throughout the state. A hospital in Gainesville was added in 2023. Pillowcases were also delivered to the local Ronald McDonald House, North Fulton Senior Services and Cobb Senior Services. To date, the Georgia Chapter has delivered 72.000+ 'smiles'.

Also, a special callout of THANKS to hospital coordinators, drop-off locations and quilt guilds for your continued support. Please he sure to include your contact information and a note when dropping off pillowcases so I know who to thank.

It has been a pleasure meeting some of you in person and working with others via email. I look forward to the continued success of the Georgia Chapter. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact me.
