Nancy Mahoney, International Teacher

Nancy has enjoyed making quilts for over 35 years, during which time an impressive range of her beautiful quilts have been featured in over 250 quilt magazines and authored 15 books since 2002. The newest book is <u>A New Twis</u>t. Nancy has designed 15 fabric collections, including eight reproduction collections. She has



taught at several AQS Shows, most recently in Daytona Beach, FL in February and Branson, MO in March. Coming up in July she will teach at a Shipshewana Retreat.

Her Program for us, titled "Two Block Wonders", will show how to place two different blocks side by side to create extraordinary quilts. She will show us that every quilter can make unique quilts. Nancy will share her quilts with us and tips for successfully pairing-up blocks to create dazzling results.

Wednesday, April 17 Feathered Star Workshop with Nationally known instructor Nancy Mahoney

Nancy is a sought after nationally known instructor. She is currently teaching a similar class at AQS in Daytona for \$125. Our class is a DEAL. Please support our guild as we host Nancy for this special occasion!

Nancy Mahoney will teach a class on making a feathered star block. The 44" x 44" block can stand alone



as a wall hanging or put 4 blocks together to create a stunning quilt. You will learn cutting and piecing techniques for making accurate triangle squares. Cost is \$45 and includes the pattern. The class will be held at Cannon Methodist Church 9:00-3:00

(This class was originally scheduled for last year. Members who were signed up will have the first opportunity to register. Those members should have already received an email from Carol Kreson.) **There are spaces available in the workshop**.
